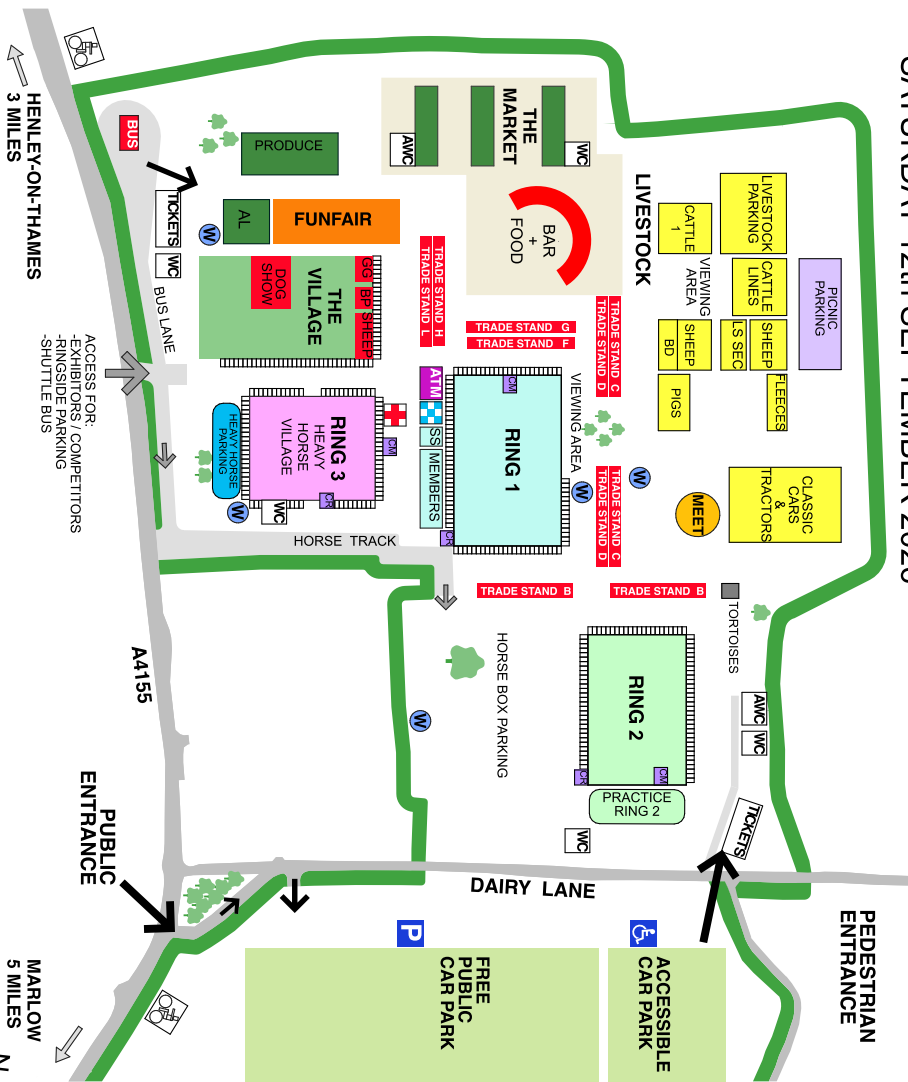

A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE HENLEY FARM & COUNTRY SHOW 1891 - 2026

Towards the end of the 19th Century, it was the fashion for landowners and their tenants to create their own Agricultural Societies. Henley farmers supported both field and show-day classes at the Royal East Berks, Wokingham Agricultural Association, Chiltern Hills, South Bucks and the Royal South Bucks Show. Henley was however conspicuous in not having its own Agricultural Association.

Richard Ovey of Badgemore was considered to be “a visionary and courageous landowner” and, despite intense competition from other established agricultural societies, decided to “go-it-alone” and founded an Association in Henley.

In 1891, acting on an idea which had been on his mind for a long time, he decided to hold a ploughing match at Hernes, his estate in the autumn of the following year. His close friend, William Anker Simmons, who was later knighted for services to agriculture, gave him encouragement.

As well as ploughing classes, there were classes for rick building, thatching, shepherding, butter, poultry, eggs and collections of vegetables at the event.

The Reading Mercury recorded on September 10th 1892: “Mr Ovey of Badgemore has set a fine example by offering prizes for good ploughing and rick building in this neighbourhood and it is hoped that his ploughing match at Hernes Farm next Thursday will be as successful as it deserves to be. There is too little inducement in these days for farm labourers to become proficient in their work and any steps in this direction must be a considerable benefit”.

In 1898 Richard Ovey instigated a public meeting to discuss a broadening of the Association's events. September 1899 saw the first expanded Henley Show, which was held at Hernes. William Anker Simmons was the Association's first honorary secretary, thus started the long association between the Henley & District Agricultural Association and Simmons and Sons.

The Show, which is now traditionally held on the second Saturday in September, has been held annually since then, with the exceptions of cancellation for the duration of both World Wars. The only other times that the Show could not be held was in 1952 due a very widespread outbreak of Foot & Mouth Disease, and in 2020 due to Covid 19.

As can be seen from the Roll of Past Presidents, Henley Farm & Country Show has been held at a variety of venues in the area: in earlier days quite often on that year's President's land. For the past twenty eight years the Show has been held at Greenlands Farm, Hambleden, which is much admired for its beautiful setting and where you are today.

At its heart is a group of some five hundred members and a dedicated band of volunteers who form its committees and provide many of the Show officials.

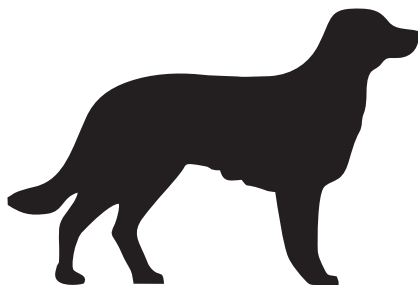

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at Kennel Club licensed events.

When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.

If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.

The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.

Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free-flowing air around the dog.

When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.

Keep your dog in the shade – take your own shade, for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.

Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

Warning: if your dog is found to be at risk, forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The Association has published a Safety Policy at www.thehenleyshow.co.uk and a copy of this policy and the current event risk assessments are available for examination in the Association Secretary's Tent. All are based on commonsense rules, competent advice and the accepted standards for running events of this type. It is a condition of entry to the Showgrounds that the entrant shall accept this policy. This applies to all servants of the Association – exhibitors, competitors, entertainers, stand holders or spectators.
2. The Association has appointed a committee and stewards who will supervise the many activities on and around the Showground throughout the day. All persons entering the Showground are to obey all reasonable requests without question where they are related to matters of public safety or where danger to property or personnel is threatened. In the unfortunate event of a major incident occurring, the police or fire brigade will in due course take the lead and will assume overall authority, but until that time the stewards and committee are to be obeyed without question.
3. The Committee of the Association do not hold themselves responsible for anything that may happen to entrants to the Showground (in whatever role they enter) or their property. It is a condition of entry to the Showground that the entrant shall indemnify the Association against any claim arising from any incident whatsoever be there damage to property or person.
4. Motor vehicles are only to be driven on the Showground at walking pace and are to be fully insured and in charge of a person with a valid driving licence at all times. Any machinery used for demonstrating entertaining or any other purpose is to be fully insured and in charge of a competent person who is familiar with the equipment. It shall only be used for the purpose for which it was originally intended.
5. The Association publishes detailed rules, regulations and conditions for all competitions. These rules may be found in the schedules of the relevant categories, e.g. livestock, horse classes, produce, dog show etc., and shall be deemed to be incorporated into the general rules.
6. The Association appoints judges and umpires for the various competitions and their decision shall be taken as final and the Association will not enter into any correspondence arising from any decision made by the approved judges and umpires or the published result of any competition.
7. The Association reserves the right to alter and amend any schedule without notice and to refuse to admit anybody or cancel any entries without assigning a reason. The Association reserves the right to change the programme without notice for whatever reason and without liability for any subsequent losses or claims.
8. "Cheap Jacks" are not admitted to the Showground and will be asked to leave by the stewards. The selling of any goods whatsoever by auction is not permitted. Shouting, creating a nuisance or any other behaviour, deliberate or inadvertent that causes annoyance to visitors, exhibitors or Members is strictly forbidden and may render the offender liable to be removed from the Showground.
9. The Henley & District Agricultural Association is a company limited by guarantee (Registered in England No 2837831) and a Registered Charity (No 1024609). The Henley Show is organised by the Committee and Stewards who are acting entirely on behalf of the Company and not in their own capacity.
